Mentor United Methodist Church Building Reopen Strategy

- I. If for any reason you are uncomfortable worshiping in person we encourage you to engage with us online.
- II. Those considered to be "at risk" are encouraged to continue to stay home and worship online. This includes those with cold or flu-like symptoms or a temperature ≥ 100.4 .
- III. Through August 2021, there will continue to be two in-house worship services: Sunday: 9 a.m. Modern Worship in Fellowship Hall 11 a.m. Traditional Worship in Sanctuary

Online worship will continue to be livestreamed at 9 and 11 on our church website @ mentorumc.org; YouTube channel; and Facebook page. The service will then be posted on each venue for viewing at other times.

- IV. Effective May 24, 2021 preregistration for worship services will no longer be necessary. (Please note that Sign-up Genius will continue to be utilized for some children and youth activities.)
- V. Through the month of June, while in the worship services everyone ages 4 or older will be asked to wear a face covering over the nose and mouth. Those who do not have a mask will be provided one.
 - 1. This will allow children who are not yet vaccinated to safely return to our facility.
 - 2. This will enable singing to resume.
 - 3. This will help us create a welcoming space for all.
- VI. Congregants are asked to take responsibility for social distancing. You are encouraged to be sensitive to those around you. Please be aware when interacting with others that everyone is at a different comfort level thus, ask permission prior to shaking hands, hugging or sharing the peace.
- VII. Traffic flow in hallways, as well as for entering and exiting worship spaces, will be clearly marked.
- VIII. There will be no fellowship hour until further notice.

- IX. Beginning June 13, 2021 Children ages 3-5 and current kindergarteners will meet on the playground (weather permitting). They will stay there for the duration of the worship service. Children in grades 1 through 6 will begin in the worship service with their parent(s). They will engage in worship for the first ten minutes and then be released to go to their group outside at a designated, secured part of the parking lot. Children two and under will remain with their families for worship.
- X. Offering Boxes will be available at each exit for envelopes and prayer cards.
- XI. Bathroom usage will be limited to one person at a time (children and a parent will be considered one unit and remain together)

Communion

The elements will be individually prepared and distributed Online "blessing of the elements" will continue

Groups may schedule a gathering at the church facility

- All gatherings must be approved by the church office
- Participants must practice social distancing
- Only the space reserved is to be used
- Wearing face coverings is encouraged, but will be optional
- The group leader will wipe down used surfaces at the end of gathering: tables, door handles, light switches, and flip the sign on the door to indicate the space has been used
- All areas will be disinfected by staff in between usages


