Second Sunday -

On this second Sunday of Advent, we remember that when Jesus came, it caused immense disruption and chaos. For Mary and Joseph who had to change their life plans, for Herod who feared a challenger to his throne, to the Jewish people who expected a different sort of Messiah. In Jesus, God was upending the old order of things and doing something new.

"For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him. The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil's work." – John 3:17 and 1 John 3:8
